

SASCA COVID-19 Event Procedures

In order to provide a safe environment for all event participants and spectators, SASCA is modifying our event procedures to best align with local and state guidelines to keep our communities safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.

We encourage everyone to maintain 6 feet of social distancing at all times throughout the event.

NEW AND MODIFIED EVENT PROCEDURES	
Sanitation	Additional sanitation stations will be provided onsite.
Loaner Helmet Program	NO LOANER HELMETS WILL BE AVAILABLE SASCA has ordered a limited number of helmets for purchase at the event. Helmets available for purchase are \$40 each.
Waiver Signing	NO GATE WORKERS There will be a Waiver Station set up where participants can sign the waiver and grab a wristband. Wristbands will be pre-separated by SASCA staff wearing gloves.
On Course Passengers	NO RIDE-ALONGS This includes novice and co-drivers. All participant vehicles may only have the driver occupying the vehicle during on course runs. Note: Co-drivers are still allowed, they just cannot ride together (one driver occupying the vehicle at a time).
Food Truck	The following procedures have been laid out by the Hijo-e-su food truck: We follow the same safety food handling guidelines as always. We implemented a couple of changes to follow regulations: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Condiments are issued upon request only 2. Pre-wrapped utensils are distributed 3. Contactless Payment methods are available (Apple/Google Pay) 4. We encourage text order @ 210 843-3655 to avoid a gathering of people around truck 5. A sign is posted on truck to practice Social Distancing
Registration	Check-in: In order to support social distancing for trailer workers, we will have: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Two registration workers inside the trailer as normal. - One registration worker set up at a table at the backside of the trailer for cash payments. Payment: Contactless card payment will be in use and highly encouraged.
Tech Inspection	BE READY TO GO WITH CLASS AND NUMBERS BEFORE LINING UP FOR TECH. To prevent too many people buzzing around in Tech, you will need to be ready with numbers and class tape/decals/magnets. If not, you will be sent back to prep in paddock. STAY IN YOUR CAR and let the tech workers inspect the car. Be prepared for them to ask you to check your throttle, etc.

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NEW AND MODIFIED EVENT PROCEDURES <i>cont...</i>	
Trailer Work	Trailer Workers: Please bring your own masks. Gloves will be provided. Timing and Radio will be setup inside the trailer. Announcer will be set up with a separate screen socially distant from Timing and Radio workers.
Course Walk	PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING Remain 6 feet apart from other event participants other than immediate family or individuals in your same household.
Novice Walkthrough	TO BE DETERMINED
Driver Meeting	DO NOT GATHER AT THE TRAILER You may listen to the meeting in paddock via the SASCA speakers or on your radio. PAY ATTENTION TO RUN/WORK ORDER DURING THE MEETING We will attempt to post the Run/Work order in the Facebook Group and SASCA.org. If this is not possible participants will need to practice social distancing at the trailer.
Course Work	PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Starter – check wristbands & helmet straps to make sure they are properly secured. - Grid – run as normal, be cognizant of distance from others. - Cone/Course – spread out and keep distance from other workers.

Note: We will continue to monitor changes in local and state guidelines and modify processes/procedures as needed to hold the event.
